Guidelines for Leaving Furano Ski Resort for Uncontrolled Areas (Backcountry)

- To prevent accidents, please use only designated exit points when leaving the controlled area.
- To prevent accidents, please remove your skis when exiting the controlled area to avoid leaving tracks that could lead others into danger.
- You must submit a designated mountain climbing notification to the nearest patrol station each time you enter the backcountry. (This will be used as reference in case of emergency)
- Please confirm you have all necessary backcountry equipment before leaving the controlled area.
- You are responsible for your own decisions and actions outside the controlled area.
- We recommend carrying equipment that can determine latitude and longitude and keeping it operational in case of emergency.

*If you do not follow these rules, we will temporarily confiscate your lift ticket.

We recommend carrying communication devices (cell phone, radio, etc.) in case of emergency.

For weather and slope conditions, please contact Ski Patrol or refer to the official Furano Ski Resort website and Facebook page.

In case of emergency, all search and rescue costs will be borne by the individual.

In case of emergency, please provide the following information: exit location from the controlled area, name, contact information, clothing color, current situation (e.g., got lost, got injured, encountered an avalanche), and your latitude and longitude. We will contact the police and act according to their instructions. We ask for your understanding and cooperation to prevent accidents.

This ski resort makes its best efforts to ensure your safety. Please understand the following matters and observe the regulatory prescribed Action Rules at Ski Resorts to prevent accidents. (Snowboarders are kindly requested to replace "ski" with "snowboard".)

- Please be aware that there are specific risks in skiing. Exercise caution to avoid the following risks.
- Risk due to weather conditions such as snow, wind and fog
- Risk due to terrain such as cliffs and irregularities
- Risk due to snow conditions such as frozen snow surfaces

and avalanches

- Risk due to natural obstacles such as rocks and standing trees
- Risk due to artificial obstacles such as lift facilities, buildings and snow vehicles
- Risk due to contact with other skiers
- Risk due to user's own negligence

2. Please do not leave controlled ski areas, and do not go beyond designated courses in the controlled areas.

3. Please do not let children act alone in a place where parents can't keep an eye on them.

4. This ski resort is not responsible for accidents due to negligence or disregard of this notification and the Action Rules at Ski Resorts.

Those who cannot accept these matters are not permitted to

ski at this ski resort.

Action Rules at Ski Resorts (formulated in October 1998)

- Do not hurt or threaten other people.
- Control your speed according to circumstances, such as the terrain, weather, snow quality, skiing skills, physical condition and competition, so you can easily stop anytime to avoid danger.
- Take care not to interfere with people skiing in front of you.
- When overtaking other people, keep a sufficient distance from them.
- When starting to ski, joining other people or crossing across

a slope, carefully look up slope to ensure your safety.

- Do not sit on a course. Refrain from stopping in a narrow area or an area with poor visibility. If you fall down, quickly clear space for other skiers.
- When climbing, walking and stopping, use the edge of the course.
- Attach flow stoppers to your skis or snowboard.
- Observe precautions given by notices, signs and announcements, and follow instructions from ski patrol and ski resort staff.
- If an accident occurs, cooperate with relief operations and reporting, and disclose your identity regardless of whether you are a person involved in the accident or a witness.
